□ **Connecticut Shotgun Manufacturing Company** announced that it is now producing higher grades of the original A-11, Fox 20-ga. double-barrel shotgun for the first time in nearly 50 years. According to the company, the guns have the same superior handling qualities and reliability as the pre-World War II guns. Receivers are scalloped, re-lined and case colored in the traditional manner. Polishing, rust bluing, engraving, stock checkering and fitting are all done manually by master craftsmen.

The entry-level CE Grade is engraved with scroll and game scenes, is stocked with

Turkish Circassian walnut, and is priced at \$5,650. Standard higher grade guns range in price from \$8,500 to \$17,500, and the Exhibition Grade retails for \$25,000. The guns will be available for inspection at upcoming trade shows, including the Las Vegas Antique Arms Show and Southeastern Wildlife Exposition in February plus the CADA/Chicago Gun Show in March.
